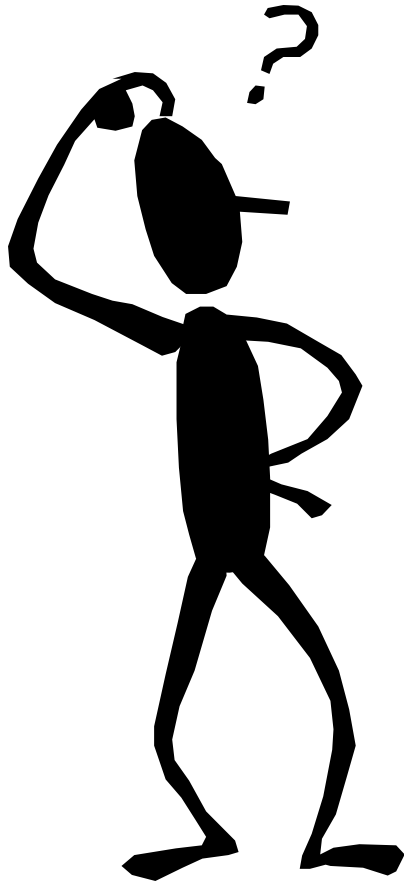

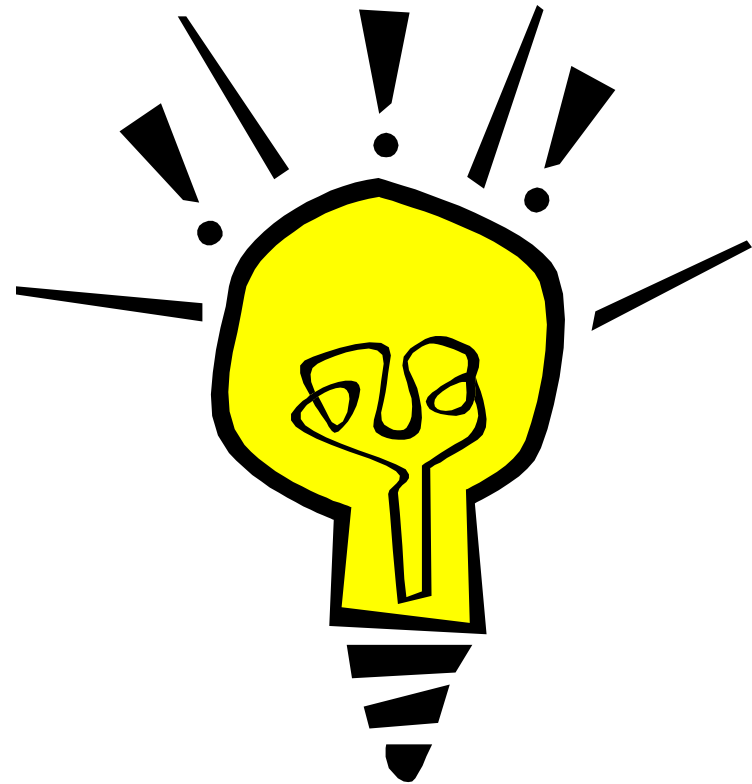

A RECONSIDERATION

⌘ *SERVICE FACILITATION*

- ☑ people aren't cases
- ☑ we don't manage them



Why is the process important?



- ⌘ Families as partners in the helping process
- ⌘ Sharing responsibility among providers to meet family needs is less overwhelming
- ⌘ Few families can be “fixed” by one person/profession/system
- ⌘ Funders are limiting the time/resources we can utilize to help families meet their needs
